An Able Swimmer

In 2008, a huge earthquake¹ hit parts of Sichuan province in China. The earthquake was one of the biggest in China and in the whole world. The earthquake destroyed buildings, roads, and transportation. Many people were badly hurt, and many died. Some were students, who were at school when the earthquake hit.

One student, Dai Guohong, lost both of his legs in the earthquake when the roof of his school fell on him and his classmates. Even though he was very badly hurt, Dai Guohong tried hard to get well again.

Guohong, who was then 18 years old, decided to try swimming because doctors told him it would make his body stronger. Now Guohong is getting ready to swim in the Paralympics² in London, England, with hundreds of other athletes with disabilities.

Guohong says that before he started swimming, he was confused about what happened to him. He says he only wanted to stay in his room alone. He didn't want to talk to anyone, and he often became angry with his mother, father, doctors, and nurses. He says that swimming changed his life.

Before he lost his legs, Guohong was not a good swimmer. But with help from a disabled sports coach and a lot of practice, Guohong is now a very strong swimmer, even without his legs. "When I started swimming, I liked it right away because it made me feel free. Suddenly, I felt like I wasn't disabled anymore," says Guohong.

In 2010, Guohong won the gold medal³ in the men's 100-meter breaststroke⁴ in China's national disabled swimming competition.

Guohong is excited about going to the Paralympics in London. He doesn't know if he will win a gold medal at the Paralympics or not, but he doesn't mind. When he comes back home, he wants to go back to school, work hard, and try more new things.
