The National Spelling Bee

Every year millions of students participate in spelling competitions around the United States. Some students can't stand the pressure and are happy to drop out in the early rounds. Some, however, study for hours a day, hoping to perform successfully on the school, local and regional levels, and make it all the way to "Bee Week"—the National Spelling Bee finals in Washington D.C.

Each year, around 280 or so kids show their spelling ability at the National Spelling Bee. However, Bee Week isn't *all* spelling. During the trip to the nation's capital, competitors also enjoy sightseeing, ice-cream socials, barbecues, and a talent show, often forming friendships that last a lifetime.

The National Spelling Bee was started by the Louisville, Kentucky newspaper the Courier-Journal in 1925. With competitions, cash prizes, and a trip to the nation's capital, the Bee hoped to stimulate an interest in spelling, often considered a 'dull' subject by students.

The National Spelling Bee, starting with only 7 competitors in its first year, is now broadcast nationwide in the United States. The final day of the two-day National Bee has been shown on cable television for many years. Since 2006, however, the final rounds have been aired on one of the United States' main television channels in primetime, reflecting the increased popularity of the competition.
