Starting Young

Sean Spooner and Louis Porter, two 14-year-old schoolboys, are believed to be the youngest publishers in the world after launching their own magazine. After only six months, the profit-making *Corby Magazine* claimed a readership of over 5,000.

Using only laptops and mobile phones, the teenagers, both students, spend every moment of their spare time working on the magazine from their bedrooms. The free publication, which features local news, events, and competitions, is funded entirely by private advertising.
